God's Scheme of Redemption

Introduction

- 1. Many speculations concerning what the Bible is about:
 - a. Some say it is a "good book" with stories that teach good morals.
 - b. Some say it is a "love letter."
 - c. Some say it is from God, but is not law; therefore we don't need to do what it says.
 - d. Some say it is a book of fictional stories meant to give men hope.
- 2. Human speculation aside, God shows us in the Scriptures what the Bible is and how it is to be used.

Discussion

I. The Scriptures: God's Plan for Man's Salvation

- A. Purpose of Scriptures:
 - 1. <u>2 Pet. 1:20-21</u>: Scriptures written by men of God who were moved by the Holy Spirit not by the will of men.
 - 2. <u>2 Tim. 3:16-17</u>: All Scripture is inspired of God and is able to make the man of God complete.
 - 3. <u>2 Tim. 3:15</u>: Through knowledge of the Scriptures, we are able to gain wisdom unto salvation.
 - 4. How?
- B. The Scriptures reveal God's plan for our salvation. The Bible teaches about...
 - 1. Our need for salvation.
 - 2. God's efforts throughout history to carry out His plan for our salvation.
 - 3. How God's plan for salvation was accomplished in Christ Jesus.
 - 4. What we must do to be saved.

II. Man's Need For Salvation

- A. In the Beginning: <u>Gen. 1-3</u>
 - 1. God created the heavens and the earth—including man.
 - 2. Man sinned
 - 3. The rest of the Bible: God dealing with man's sin!
- B. One overall lesson we learn from the Bible is our need for salvation.
 - 1. All have sinned and fall short of the glory of God (<u>Rom. 3:23</u>).
 - a. Abraham sinned.
 - b. Moses sinned.
 - c. King David sinned.
 - d. You and I have sinned.
 - 2. In the Bible, we learn that because of our sins, we need God—we need salvation!

III. God's Efforts to Bring About Salvation

- A. Since the beginning:
 - 1. After fall of man, God revealed a plan in <u>Gen. 3:15</u>
 - a. Seed of woman would bruise serpent's head.

- b. Seed of woman is Christ, serpent is Satan.
- c. At the cross, Jesus severely wounded Satan and the evil that he was doing (<u>1 John</u> <u>3:8</u>).
- 2. Noah and the flood: God saved a remnant of obedient—human kind continued, salvation still to come.
- 3. Abraham: God made a covenant through which He would bless all nations through the Seed of Abraham. That seed was Christ (<u>Gal. 3:16</u>).
- B. Throughout Israelite History:
 - 1. Abraham's descendants became a nation—through whom Christ would come.
 - 2. Through Joseph in Egypt, God preserved that nation and allowed them to grow.
 - 3. God delivered a pattern to Moses, but showed that another would come after him who would be greater (<u>Deut. 18:18</u>—Christ).
 - 4. Throughout entire O.T. thousands of Messianic prophecies were made to point to the time of salvation.
 - 5. All roads in the O.T. lead to salvation in Christ!

IV. God's Plan Fulfilled in Christ

A. <u>Eph. 3:11</u>: God's eternal purpose fulfilled in Christ.

- 1. God the word (Christ, John 1:1) became flesh (John 1:14).
- 2. He humbled Himself (Phil. 2:6-8).
- 3. He fulfilled all O.T. prophecies concerning Him (<u>Acts 13:29</u>).
- 4. He was offered as a sacrifice for our sins (Isa. 53).
- 5. He rose from the dead on the third day (<u>1 Cor. 15:4</u>).
- 6. He is now alive as High Priest and King at the right hand of God (Acts 2:29-36).
- B. Through the above, Christ became the author of eternal salvation TO ALL WHO OBEY HIM (**Heb. 5:8-9**).
 - 1. Matt. 28:20: "...teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you..."
 - 2. O.T. teaches us the need for salvation, and our need for obedient faith (<u>Heb. 11</u>, esp. vs. 13).
 - 3. N.T. teaches us what we must believe for salvation, what to do to be saved in Christ, and how to live as faithful Christians.
 - 4. The complete Bible teaches us God's entire scheme of redemption.
- C. Where to begin?
 - 1. <u>Mark 16:15</u>: Preach the gospel to every creature. Then what?
 - 2. <u>Rom. 10:17</u>: Faith comes by hearing God's word.
 - 3. <u>Mark 16:16</u>: When we hear the gospel, we must believe.
 - 4. <u>Acts 2:38</u>: If we believe that Christ died for our sins, then we must repent of those sins (turn away from them).
 - 5. <u>Rom. 10:14</u>: If we believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, then we must be willing to confess Him as such.
 - 6. <u>Matt. 28:19</u>; <u>Mark 16:16</u>; <u>Acts 2:38</u>; <u>Rom. 6:3-4</u>: If we are willing to confess Christ as Lord with our mouths then we must be submit to Him in obedience through baptism.
 - 7. <u>Matt. 28:18-20</u>: Following baptized we must be committed to living faithful to His word—the New Testament Scriptures.
