# Whom Do You Follow?

Part Two: Are You Following Jesus?

## Introduction

- 1. In the previous lesson we discussed who Jesus is, in order to get a clearer picture of the person that we must be following.
- 2. Knowing who Jesus is helps us to understand WHY we need to follow Him.
- 3. Now we must be about learning HOW to follow Him.
  - a. To do this fully one must study the entire New Testament.
  - b. In this lesson, however, we will simply consider the kind of approach we need to have toward following Jesus.

## Discussion

#### I. Be Like Your Master

- A. <u>Matt. 10:24-25</u>: "It is enough for a disciple to be like his master."
  - 1. We follow Jesus by imitating Him (1 Cor. 1:11); and walking as He walked (1 John 2:6).
  - 2. We also follow Him by having the same mind as He had (Phil. 2:5).
  - 3. This is what Paul meant when He said, "...yet not I, but Christ lives in me..." (Gal. 2:20).
- B. Luke 6:40: "Everyone who is perfectly trained will be like his master."
  - 1. Our goal is to be like Jesus.
  - 2. We have His teachings and the teachings of the rest of the New Testament to train us.
  - 3. Let us therefore strive, as His disciples, to be like Him.

## II. The Characteristics of Jesus:

A. Love:

- 1. Jesus gave His life for us because He and the Father loved us (John 3:16; Rev. 1:5).
- 2. Thus, as His disciples, we are commanded to be like Him in love:
  - a. Love for one another (John 13:34).
  - b. Love for Him and for God (<u>1 John 4:19</u>).
- B. Complete and limitless devotion:
  - 1. Jesus never looked back when He came down from heaven and suffered as He did (<u>Phil. 2:6-8</u>).
  - 2. While on the earth He always strove to do the will of the Father; He never set aside God's commands for any reason (John 8:29; 5:30; Matt. 4:8-10; 26:48-50).
  - 3. Thus, we are commanded to be like Him (Matt. 12:50).
- C. Faithfulness:
  - 1. <u>2 Tim. 2:13</u>: No matter what we do, Jesus is faithful. But if we want to be with Him we must learn to be faithful as He is.
  - 2. <u>Matt. 10:37-39</u>: Jesus said, He who loves anyone or anything more than Him "*is not worthy of Me*."
    - a. What He's saying is that His disciples need to show the same level of faithfulness toward Him that He showed toward us when He gave His life (<u>Rev. 2:10</u>, "*till death*").
    - b. If we want to be worthy of Him, then we must set aside our selfish desires and show the same kind of faithfulness toward the will of the Father that Jesus did.

## III. The Way, Truth, Life

A. Way:

- 1. "The way by which one passes" (Thayer); "Used of a traveler's way...a journey...means of access" (Vine's).
- 2. The idea is "coming to the Father"; Jesus is the way by which we do that. But how?
- B. Truth: Jesus leads us to the Father with the truth.
  - 1. He scrapes away the ignorant speculation of the world in order to show us the true nature of God and how we must live before Him.
  - 2. Through His teaching and His examples we are able to see clearly the kind of lives God wants us to live—lives based on truth.
- C. Life: Jesus provides the way to life (through His death), and He is the source of life.

#### D. Why Follow Him?

- 1. Because He is the only way!
  - a. Jesus not only shows us the way, He IS the way!
  - b. Jesus is the truth because His life is the life we should have lived, but where Jesus was glorified, by sin we fell short of God's glory (Rom. 3:23).
- 2. But now He gives us a second opportunity at a life of righteousness and faithfulness to God
- 3. Thus, it is said that God prepared beforehand the kinds of works that we should do in Christ (<u>Eph. 1:10</u>)—that is, He determined beforehand that we should live like Christ.
- 4. If we claim to follow Jesus, but do not strive to live like Him, then we are saying that Jesus is not worth it to us! (<u>Heb. 10:26-29</u>).

#### IV. Following Jesus Today

- A. Following Jesus is more than an American pastime.
  - 1. We are not talking about a joining a bowling league; we are not talking about joining a soft-ball team.
  - 2. Following Christ is not a seasonal activity.
  - 3. There is no such thing as a part-time Christian.
  - 4. Jesus did not take a vacation from God, and neither can we!
- B. Following Christ is about find the only access we have to the presence of God—to life.
- C. Jesus is the only way, and if we do not follow Him faithfully, then we cannot enter in by that way (Luke 13:24).

#### Conclusion: Whom Do You Follow?

- 1. Do you follow Jesus, or do you follow...
  - a. Tradition? Col. 2:8; 1 Pet. 1:18
  - b. The crowd? John 12:42
  - c. Convenience? <u>Luke 18:22; Acts 24:24-26</u>
  - d. Physical gain? (I'll serve God as long as He gives me what I want).
  - e. Other men? <u>1 Cor. 1:11-12; Phil. 2:12</u>.
- 2. If we follow these other things, then our devotion is only as strong as what we seek (all of these other things will be destroyed).
- 3. If we follow Jesus, then nothing will get in the way of our serving Him; and nothing can separate us from the Father (<u>Rom. 8:31</u>).
- 4. Will you follow Jesus?
